Diversity

Diversity within our workforce (39% staff from Black, Asian, mixed and other ethnicities and 61% white) was higher than the percentage within the adult social care sector (68% white, derived from the Skills for Care, State of the adult social care sector and workforce in England report, October 2024), which is noted already as more diverse that the population of England (81% white)¹.

Within the adult social care sector, there was a particularly higher proportion of Black ethnic groups (18%) compared to the wider population (4%). This trend was even greater within our organisation, with Black staff representing 30.8% of our workforce.

Although there was no significant difference in the percentage of Asian staff within the sector and wider population (11% and 10% respectively), within our organisation there were significantly less Asian staff (5.4%).

¹ Figures from the 2021 census for England and Wales show that white ethnicities made up 81.7% of the population, Asian ethnicities 9.3%, Black ethnicities 4%, mixed or multiple ethnicities 2.2%, and other ethnic groups 1%.
